2019-2020 CELL PHONE POLICY

Policy: Cell phones are not allowed in classrooms (Board Policy 632). Cell phones must be turned off while on PBP Campus during the school day and locked up in teacher’s classroom upon arrival/departure. The school is not liable for lost or stolen cell phones. The school highly suggests not having a cell phone at school. Please ensure you are aware of the apps on your child’s phone.

Violation of this policy will result in the following action by Pi Beta Phi Staff and Administration:

1. The cell phone is held by the school for 5 calendar days UNLESS the parent/ guardian picks it up earlier.
2. If a student is caught using another student’s cell phone, BOTH students will face disciplinary consequences as outlined in the policy.

Consequences:

1. **Warning: Level 1: Warning.** This is only if the cell phone is secured properly but goes off during school hours.
2. **First Offense: Level 2: Office Referral;** ½ day of In school suspension, and the cell phone must be picked up by a parent/guardian.
3. **Second Offense: Level 2: Office Referral;** 1 day of In school suspension, and the cell phone must be picked up by a parent/guardian.
4. **Third Offense: Level 2: Office Referral;** 3 days of In school suspension, the cell phone must be picked up by a parent/guardian. **Disciplinary Probation:** loss of cell phone privileges at school for the remainder of the school year.
5. **Violation of Disciplinary Probation: Level 2: Office Referral;** Out of school suspension, alternative school placement, or other consequences as deemed appropriate by the administration.
